

Guiding Principles to support Board and subgroup members in reviewing or evaluating proposals and/or submissions

Subgroups of the Drogheda Implementation Board are tasked with the delivery of actions listed in the Drogheda Report Implementation Plan and identification of emergent actions.

Therefore, they may receive requests for support, endorsement, funding or guidance regarding projects and initiatives. The below questions serve as a guide for subgroup members when considering whether to recommend to the Drogheda Implementation Board and in giving guidance to project promoters.

Any proposals must satisfy the 'alignment to plan' principles to proceed any further.

The Board and subgroups of the Board may decide to 'weight' specific guiding principles.

3.1	Is there evidence of capacity to deliver?	
3.2	Does it displace currently existing service delivery?	
3.3	Does it 'add value' to the local landscape?	
3.4	Could/Should it be supported via a mainstream funding stream?
